



THE VASA MUSEUM



The Vasa Museum, ranked as one of 10 best museums in the World, is a must visit while you are in Stockholm.

Commissioned in the 1620s by The Lion of the North, King Gustav II Adolf, during Sweden's Great Power Era, this Royal war ship was to be the most powerful warship not only in the Baltic Sea, but perhaps in the entire World.

But during its maiden voyage on August 10 1628, the Vasa capsized and sank into the Stockholm harbor, in front of thousands of people including several foreign Ambassadors.

After lying on the seabed of the Baltic Sea for 333 years, the Vasa was "rediscovered" and salvaged after a long and difficult process. The Vasa is not only one of Sweden's most important treasures but also the World's, as it is the only and best preserved 1600's galleon that exists.

The Vasa does not appear to be a ship that was wrecked and salvaged, but rather it seems to be a ship awaiting for her next trip.

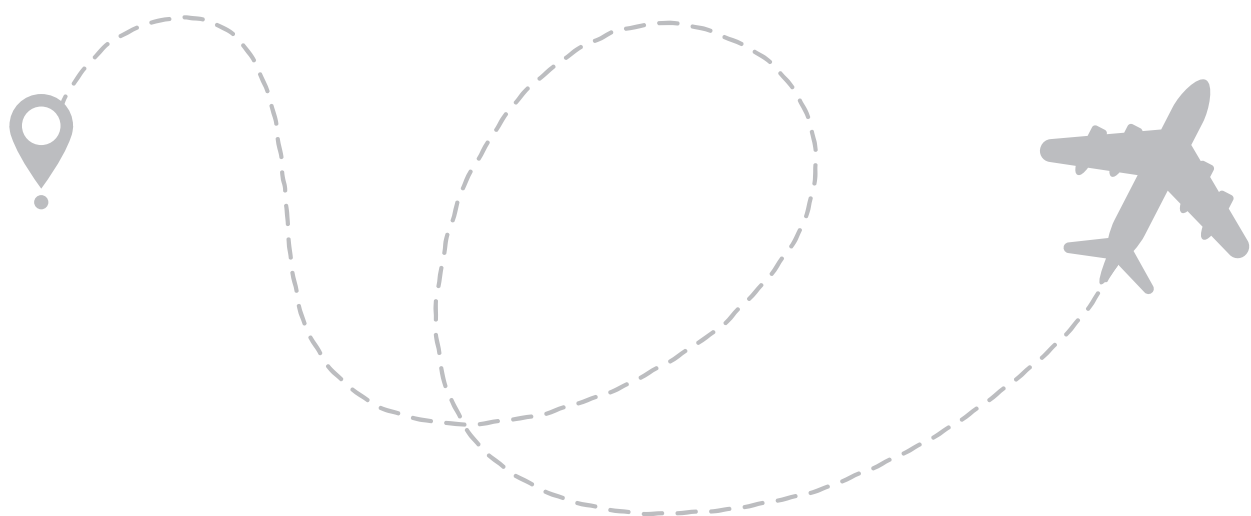

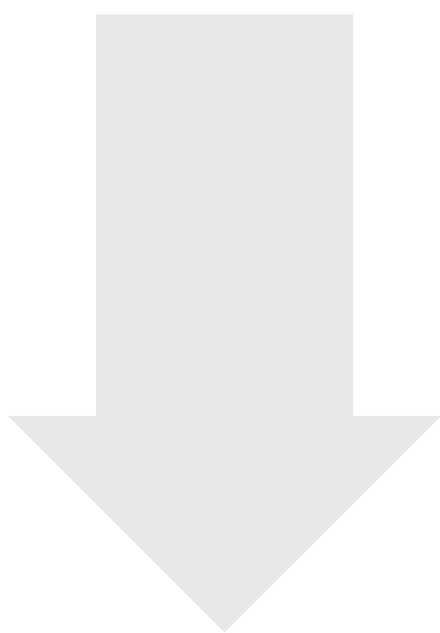

SKANSEN



Skansen is the first open-air museum in the world.

It was built in 1891 by Artur Hazelius to exhibit and preserve the traditions, culture and way of life from the different regions of Sweden, starting from the beginning of the 1300s to the 1920s.

In its 300.000 square mts., you will have the opportunity to see around 150 houses that A. Hazelius bought and had them shipped piece by piece the island of Djurgården. Once here, each building was rebuilt exactly as it was, including all their original furniture and artifacts.

Skansen also has a zoo with a wide range of Scandinavian animals including the bison, brown bear, moose, reindeer and wolverine.

Every year on June 6th, the King and Queen of Sweden, together with the Royal Family comes here to celebrate Sweden's National Day.

PRINCE EUGENE WALDEMARSUDDE MUSEUM

Prince Eugene's Waldemarsudde Museum located in the island of Djurgården, is one of the most important and beautiful museums in Stockholm. It was the main residence and art studio of Prince Eugene, the youngest brother of king Gustav VI Adolf. The Prince was not only a famous art collector, but also one of the leading landscape painters and artists of his generation.

The museum consists of the Mansion, which was the Prince's residence built in 1903 and the gallery building built in 1913.

The museum also displays sculptures by the world famous Swedish sculptor Carl Milles. In here you will also be able to see several historic buildings like the Linseed Oil Mill, from 1785 which is 1 of only 5 left in the world.

When Prince Eugene died, he bequeathed all his possessions, and his art collection to the Swedish people.
